ABOUT CONCRETE

Pottery Barn concrete tables are handmade of a custom engineered concrete mix, then finished and sealed using proprietary methods. Inherent variations in the shading and color of the concrete, as well as in the casting process, make each table truly unique.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- The hand-molded top shows many surface textures and color variations (swirls, small scratches, bubbles/pin-holes). Weather spots, pores, mold impressions are inherit of the material and construction.
- Non-structural hairline cracks and air bubbles can appear on the surface due to age and exposure to elements. These do not affect the integrity of the tabletop.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- To clean, use only a soft, very slightly damp cloth. Wipe up spills quickly to avoid staining.
- NEVER USE ABRASIVE PADS, VINEGAR, BLEACH, ALCOHOL, HOUSEHOLD CLEANERS, TURPENTINE OR MINERAL SPIRITS.
- Avoid accidentally hitting the tabletop's edges, as this can cause small chips.
- To prevent scratches, do not place or drag coarse objects across the surface.
- Avoid contact with acidic materials such as citrus or olive oil, as they can damage the sealant.
- Do not place extremely items directly onto the tabletop, as this can cause sealant discoloration.
- A light application of a quality furniture wax is also a good cleaning agent and protects the finish concurrently.

ABOUT ACACIA WOOD

Our outdoor Abbott Collection is crafted from Acacia wood, a dense hardwood commonly used for outdoor furniture due to its resistance to decay and mildew

WHAT TO EXPECT

This collection has a protective oil finish to help extend beauty of the natural wood color, however overtime it will slowly attain a natural silver-gray patina. This is a purely cosmetic change and will not affect the integrity of the furniture

Note, as Acacia naturally contains moisture-resistant oil, oil may seep out following the first few rainfalls. To protect cushions from oil residue, remove the cushions before inclement weather. Once the furniture attains a natural silver-gray patina, the furniture oil will no longer bleed.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

While weathering and color variation over time is natural for wood outdoor furniture, we recommend the following care for best results:

- Store wood furniture indoors out of season. Make sure furniture is completely dry before storage.
- Cover furniture with outdoor covers when left outside during inclement weather or when not in use.
- Wipe spills with a clean dry cloth.
- Avoid the use of harsh cleaners and abrasives.

LONG TERM CARE

To revive weathered furniture, sand and clean the wood to remove all debris and previous treatment. You may then apply any deck stain in the color of your choice. Note that two coats are required to achieve your desired color.
